

On at least five different occasions, Jesus claimed to be the theme of the entire OT (NIV – Jesus words in quotes):

- 1. Matt. 5:17 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them."
- 2. Lk. 24:27 And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.
- 3. V. 44 He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."
- 4. Jn. 5:39 "You study the Scriptures diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me,"
- 5. Heb. 10:7 Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll I have come to do your will, my God.'" (Ps. 40:7-8A, from LXX, "Here I am, I have come it is written about me in the scroll. I desire to do your will, my God; your law is within my heart.")



INTERESTING CHARACTERS AND THEMES POINTING TO CHRIST...

Melchizedek a *Type of Christ* (Gen. 14:18-20; Heb7:3) Melchizedek (Gen. 14: 18-20) is an actual historical person – a mere being – who was a type of Christ like the Son of God. He was brought on the scene of history as a type of the Messiah, the Lord Jesus. His name is made up of two words meaning "king" and "righteous". He was also a priest. He is a foreshadow therefore of Christ as a righteous King/Priest. Salem where Melchizedek was king, means peace pointing to Christ as the King of peace, as an application prophesy.

Isa. 7:14; Hag. 2:9,23; Mat. 1:23 – We will trace, the Immanuel Theme of God Dwelling On Earth with His people, in the: Tabernacle; Temple; at the 1st Coming with His only Son; finally in Revelation with Himself!
