Types of Prophesies (II Pe. 1:19-21)

- <u>Direct</u> Micah 5:2 –Jesus Birth in Bethlehem; Malachai 3:1 John the Baptist sequence with Jesus; Zechariah 9:9 The
 arrival of the expected King of Israel on a donkey
 - <u>Typical</u>, A type pointing to Christ tabernacling with us (cf. Isa. 7:14; Ex. 25:8-9, 40 The tabernacle construction) = You Will Work on this one during your team time. "God with us"
- <u>Applications</u>, some are by assonance (sounds like), i.e. resemblance of sounds in words, i.e. branch = nezer; nezer = a Nazarene (Matt. 2:23; Is. 11:1) We must be very careful of these due to spiritualizing of Hebrew Scriptures that was intense in the 1st Century AD

The Edenic Prediction (Gen. 3:15) The Noahic Prediction (9:25-27) The Abrahamic Prediction (12:1-3) The Judaic Prediction (49:8-12) The Blaamic Prediction (Num. 24:15-19) The Mosaic Prediction (Deut. 18:5,18)*

The Logos Doctrine and the Eternality of Christ

To grasp the full import of the *Logos* doctrine and its relevance to the eternality of Christ, let us close by briefly reviewing what we have learned. We have seen that John views the true significance of the work of Christ from the perspective of eternity. He thus begins his Gospel by telling us that Jesus the divine Word has existed for all eternity *as* God and *with* God —

that is, as God the Son and with God the Father. Indeed, prior to the beginning of time, Jesus enjoyed an eternal loving fellowship with the Father and with the Holy Spirit. Plurality within the Godhead is clearly evident in John's Gospel.

When Jesus stepped out of his glorious abode in heaven and became a man, his human body was, in a sense, a temple in which the Shekinah glory dwelt. This recalls how the Shekinah glory dwelt in the Tabernacle in Old Testament times.

So, let's look at the Tabernacle in Ex. 35-40 in our "Scratching the Surface" of some interesting aspects of God's Glory revealed in Jesus Christ

Quote from Ref. 1, pages 163-4 – End of Chapter 8

From the Genesis 1 to Malachi...

"We can be assured from Genesis to Malachi that the whole Earth will be filled with a knowledge of Christ's glory as the waters cover the sea."*

Habakkuk 2:14 (NIV) For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

Malachi 1: 11 (NIV) My name will be great among the nations, from where the sun rises to where it sets. In every place incense and pure offerings will be brought to me, because my name will be great among the nations," says the Lord Almighty.
