### We Have seen in Acts, Various Levels of God's Plan

- The Universal Plan of God, hidden as a "mystery" until now...
  - God uses the players within a wicked world framework, to accomplish His divine purposes using people sold out to Him,
  - His Divine Purpose is to Bring Gentiles and Jews together in a single "body" - the Church..
- □ The Church is the "Mystery" (Rev. 1:20), for whom It's...
  - Principal task is evangelization and discipleship
  - Through it's problems it accomplishes the great commission using a framework outlined in Acts programmatic verse (Acts 1:8) and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20)
- He has a Plan for Us Now...
  - The Holy Spirit and His infilling in the life of the believer is the driving powder for ministry in Jesus name

How the apostles died, all but Judas lends credibility to our faith, since they Died martyrs death except for Judas Iscariot and John the Beloved...

Died martyrs death except for Judas Iscariot and John the Beloved  Name of Apostle  Cause of Death	
-	
Simon Peter	crucified upside down
Andrew, Peter's brother	crucified
James, the son of Zebedee	beheaded by Herod Agrippa I
John	exiled, died of old age (brother of James)
Matthew	died a martyr in Ethiopia
Bartholomew	beaten then crucified. (aka Nathanael)
Philip	crucified
Thomas	speared to death
Simon, the zealot	crucified
James	stoned to death
Thaddaeus	stoned to death. (aka Judas son of James)
Judas Iscariot	suicide by hanging

--> Matthias replaced Judas (Acts 1:26)

# Thessalonian - A church with out clear freedom for the Holy Spirit to move in their midst

Frowned on any manifestation of the Spirit and Anything out of the ordinary.

I Thes. 5:19-22

The church was quenching the Spirit, by turning to another gospel

# Corinthian -A church with

Over-manifestation and dis-orderliness in relation to the gifts of the Spirit

I Cor. 14:26-33

The church was quenching the Spirit by being carnal, and being dis-orderly with respect to the ministry of the Holy Spirit

# Galatians a legalistic church

Lack of Liberty because of bondage to legalism. **Galatians 1:6;3:27;4:9** 

The church was quenching the Spirit by turning away from the true gospel
